

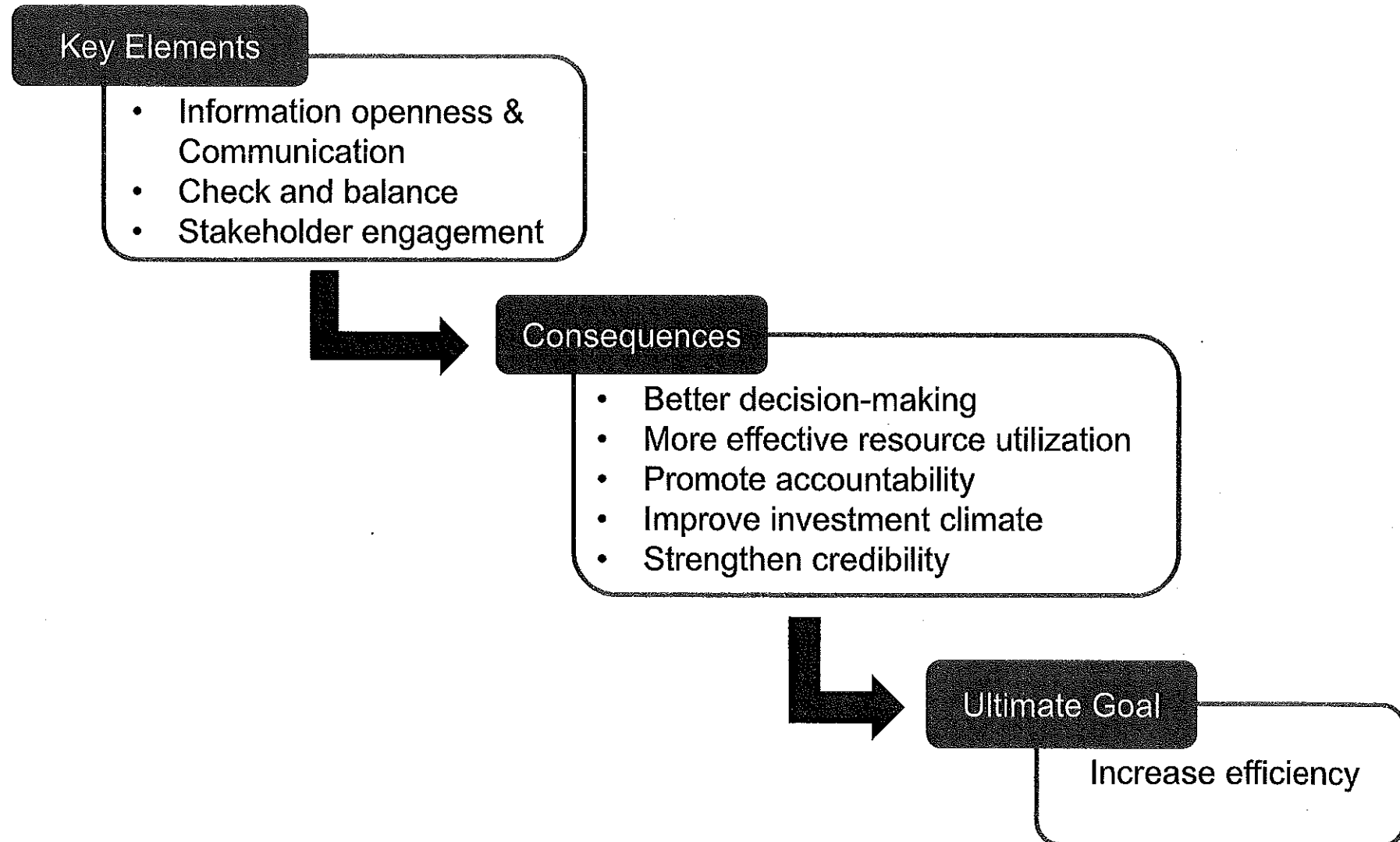

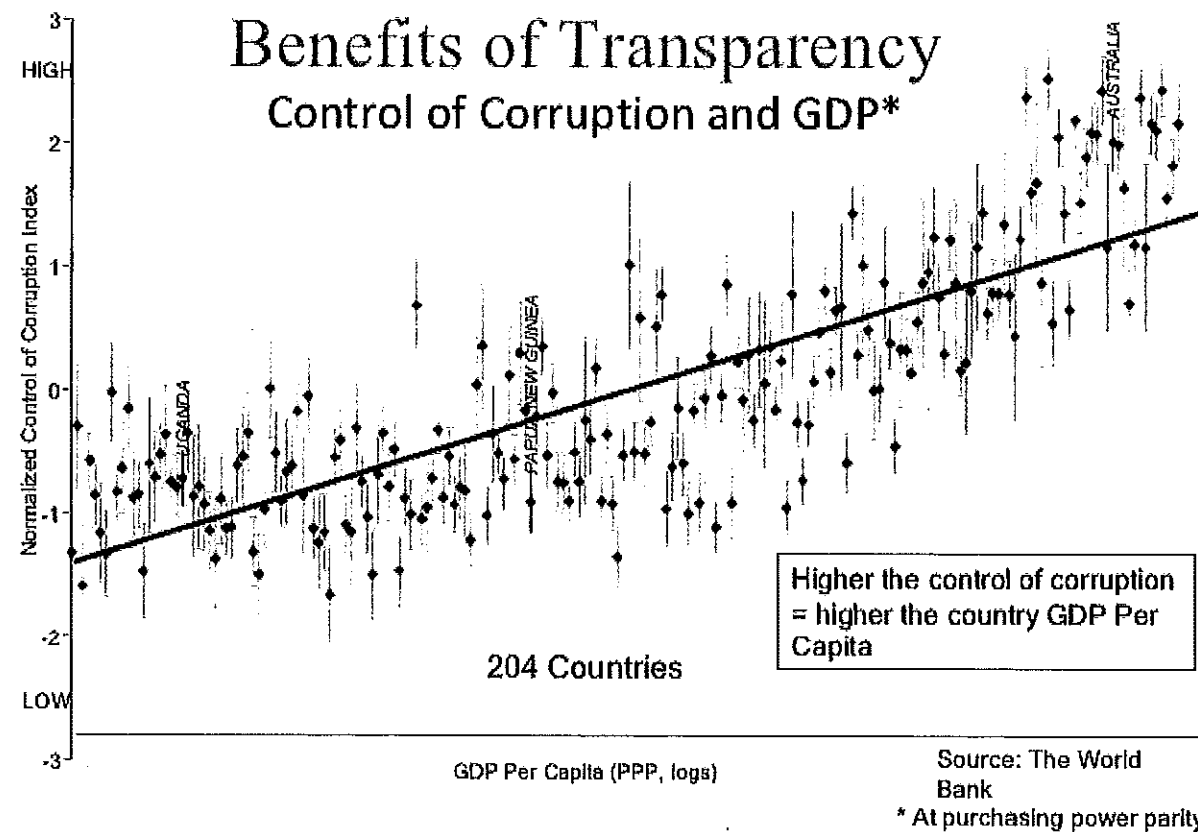

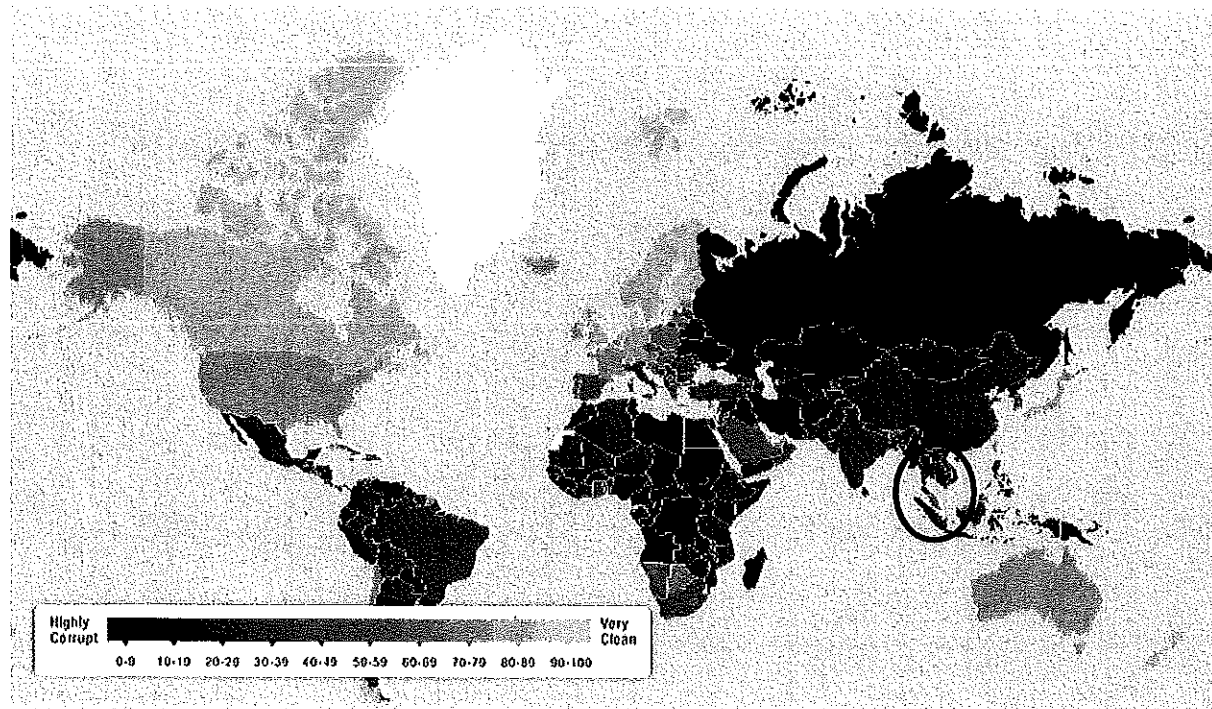
“The less corruption, the higher GDP”

*Dark red indicates a highly corrupt in public sector

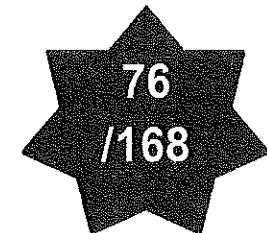
